Getting to Tigh a' Mhaide

We are easy to find but satnavs can become confused as our postcode covers a very wide area. Please follow these directions.

The village of Brig o' Turk lies on the A821 between Loch Achray and Loch Venachar around seven miles west of Callander and 8 miles north of Aberfoyle.

Travelling from the south or east by motorway.

From Carlisle take the M73/M74 north following signs for Stirling. From Glasgow, take the M80 and M9 north towards Stirling. From Edinburgh take the M9 towards Stirling.

At Stirling, leave the M9 at Junction 10 and turn onto the A84 following the signs for Crianlarich, The Trossachs and Callander. Continue for around 17 miles until you reach Callander.

Continue on the main road (still the A84) straight through Callander and keep going on the same road beyond the village for about one mile to Kilmahog. You will pass The Trossachs Woollen Mill and the Kilmahog Woollen Mill on your right. You will see The Lade Inn on your left. Turn left onto the A821 towards Aberfoyle and the Loch Katrine Steamship, passing immediately in front of The Lade Inn.

Follow the road for approximately five miles along the north shore of Loch Venachar until you come to the village of Brig o' Turk. Stay on the main road (still the A821) until you have passed the tearoom on your right. We are the next track on the left just after the doublebend sign. If you get as far as the Byre Inn, you've gone too far.

From the north

From Inverness, Aberdeen, Dundee or Perth, follow the A9 south towards Dunblane. Leave the A9 by the exit for the A820 signposed for the A84/Dunblane/Doune/Callander. The slip road from the A9 ends in a T-junction. Turn right onto the A820 towards Doune/Callander. Continue on the A820 for about four miles until you read the village of Doune. Carry straight on through the village on the main street until you reach a T-junction. Turn right onto the A84 for Callander. From here follow the directions in bold above.

From the north west

From Oban, Fort William & Glencoe, take the A82 or the A85 to Crianlarich. Travel south through the village of Crianlarich on the A85 to Lochearnhead. Continue through Lochearnhead on the A84 towards Strathyre and Callander. Continue on this road for about 12 miles until you come to Kilmahog. At the junction of the A84 with the A821, turn right at The Lade Inn towards Aberfoyle and the Loch Katrine Steamship. You will pass immediately in front of The Lade Inn.

Follow the road for approximately five miles along the north shore of Loch Venachar until you come to the village of Brig o' Turk. Stay on the main road (still the A821) until you have passed

the tearoom on your right. We are the next track on the left just after the double-bend sign. If you get as far as the Byre Inn, you've gone too far.

From Aberfoyle and the south (non-motorway)

Take the A81 to Aberfoyle and continue on the main street through the village and following the road as it bends sharp right and starts to climb. You are now on the Duke's Pass. Follow the road past up the hill and down the other side. Keep going round the head of Loch Achray and along the north shore of the loch until you cross a stone, arched bridge over the river. You'll see The Byre Inn on your right. Take the track next right just about opposite the 'Brig o' Turk' village sign is. If you get as far as the junction with the tearoom, you've gone too far.
